

### September 1-15

Bear Lake County, Bingham County within the Blackfoot Reservoir drainage, and Caribou County **except that portion within the Fort Hall Indian Reservation.**



## Shot and Weapon Restrictions:

- Nontoxic Shot/Sizes: Canada geese may legally be taken with shot size T (0.2 inches in diameter) or smaller (non-toxic).
- No person may take migratory game birds with any shotgun capable of holding more than three (3) shells unless it is plugged with a one-piece filler that is incapable of removal without disassembling the gun.

## Canada Goose Hunt Area Description:

Bear Lake County, Bingham County within the Blackfoot Reservoir drainage, and Caribou County **except that portion within the Fort Hall Indian Reservation.**



## Requirements:

- Valid Idaho hunting license
- Federal Migratory Game Bird Harvest Information Program (HIP) Validation.
- Federal Migratory Bird (Duck) Stamp for all hunters 16 or older.
- Nontoxic shot. Please see <http://fishandgame.idaho.gov/content/nontoxic>

It is the responsibility of the hunter to become familiar with the rules that affect the hunt in which he or she is participating. This brochure provides seasons for early Canada goose seasons, and it provides a summary of rules that govern early Canada goose seasons in Idaho.
